State Update

- There are currently 4173 transients, with 783 in violation. This represents a 1.24 % increase since May 2009, 34% since December 2008, and a 103.56 % increase since July 2007, when we started counting.
- Association for the Treatment of Sexual Abusers (ATSA) conference will be held from September 30 to October 3, 2009 in Dallas, Texas. Gerry Blasingame and Suzanne Brown-McBride are both presenting.
- Suzanne Brown-McBride asks about the fallout since CDCR dropped 60 day housing vouchers. Robert Ambroselli says he does not believe revocation rates have changed, though a closer look at the data may be necessary. What he believes is making a bigger impact is the stringently restrictive ex post facto residence restrictions being passed in California cities and counties, such as in San Diego County.
